Students use the strategies of mathematicians, scien-

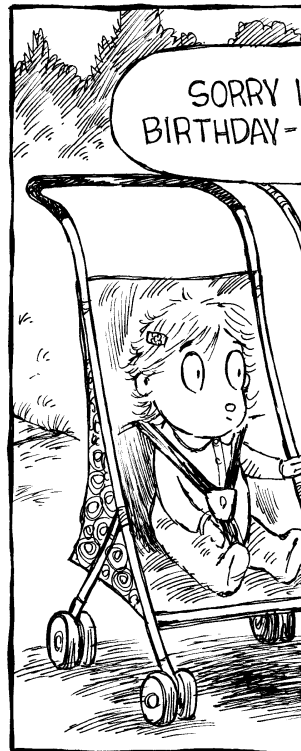
tists, authors and artists during these investigations.
