

COVID PROTOCOLS

The CDC declared the end of the federal COVID-19 Public Health Emergency on May 11, 2023, but maintains that prevention strategies remain a public health priority. Our protocols at University Lake School are consistent with the Contagious Disease policy outlined in our Family Handbook and follow the recommendations of the CDC.

We have 5 priorities as a school that we hope are reflected in our health protocols:

- 1- A continued commitment to maintaining the highest standards of health and safety
- 2- Providing the Laker experiences we love and need
- 3- An abiding attention and care for the most vulnerable among us
- 4- A spirit of goodwill and flexibility to accommodate a community of many needs
- 5- A habit of candor and respect to be a community that listens and communicates well

POSITIVE CASES: Students and staffulty are expected to follow CDC updated guidance on isolation and precautions after a COVID infection as outlined here. If you have a positive case, stay home for five days after the first onset of symptoms that led you to test. If you have a fever, stay home.

COMMUNICATIONS: Whenever a child is sick with a contagious disease, parents are required to notify the School, consistent with the recommendations of the Wisconsin Department of Health Services described here. As with all contagious diseases listed, the School will notify the parents/students of the ULS division or grade with a positive COVID case.

DUE DILIGENCE: We aim to keep COVID off campus by testing and staying home when sick, practicing good hygiene, maintaining a clean and ventilated facility, and by following our health protocols. The ULS Leadership Team and Health & Safety Committee stay abreast of and include for your own ongoing reference the CDC Operational K-12 Guidance, Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, and Waukesha County Health Department.
